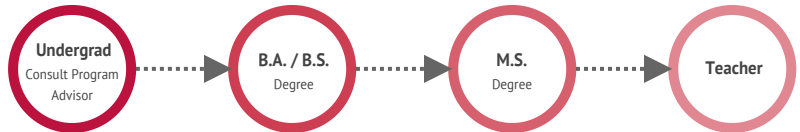

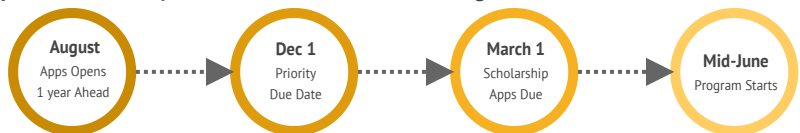

Average Salary in WI is ~\$55,000 / 9 months

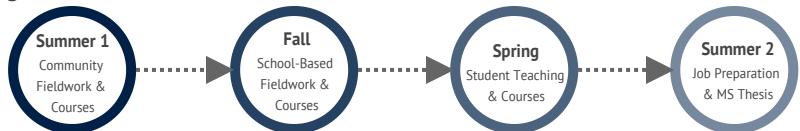
Preparation: Earn B.A./B.S. in Content, Then M.S. with Certification & Degree

- ☑ English Proficiency
Non-native English speakers must show adequate instructional, verbal skills by passing a TOEFL exam and an interview with the World Languages team

- ☑ 2 Letters of Recommendation
Select recommenders who can speak to your understandings of diverse members in your school/community

LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

May be demonstrated in a variety of ways:
Exam, Coursework, and/or Life Experiences

- ☑ Degree in Language of Licensure
College/University degree or equivalent course load completed within past 2 years
- ☑ Significant Experience in Language of Licensure
 - Degree (in any discipline) from an institution in which all/most coursework was delivered in the language of licensure (e.g., non-US institution)
 - Native/heritage speaker of the language of licensure
- ☑ ACTFL Exam

-Passing score or Intermediate High on the Oral & Written Exams of the language you wish to be certified in. Must be taken within 2 years of admission to program.

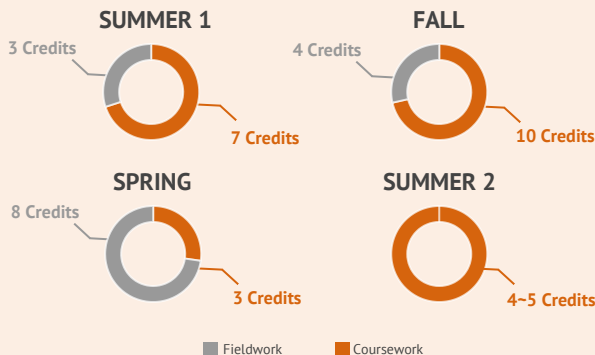
